# **Homework**

Homework is given out fortnightly to students starting from Week 2. It is an expectation that each student attempts homework each fortnight and hands in their workbook for correction with their teacher. Passwords Mathletics (maths) and EPIC (literacy) apps will be sent home with your child.

# **Hats and Water Bottles**

During Term 1 and the beginning of Term 2, students are required to wear a broad brim hat outside. Students who do not have a hat will be spending their recess and lunch in shaded areas.

Water bottles are allowed on tables so that students can hydrate while working. Please make sure all student belongings are labelled so they can be returned to the correct owner if lost.

#### **COMPASS**

COMPASS is our main platform for communicating school related information. You can also get information from our Facebook page and school website. COMPASS is used to access your child's reports, pay and give permission for events and to email your child's teacher.

### **Learning Focus for Term 2**

## <u>Reading</u>

In **Reading**, students will explore different reading strategies, for example; SQ3R, Summarising, Analysing and Critiquing. They will identify key features of a non-fiction text and use strategies to find important information in the text. Students will identify the main points in a text, break down parts of a text and examine the text through the use of questioning.

## **Maths**

In **Maths**, students will begin the term with solidifying their understanding of addition and subtraction. Students will then explore data and statistics through investigating real life examples, such as sport statistics. Students are also going to learn about multiplication and division and both written and mental strategies to solve these operations. Lastly, students will explore 3-dimensional shapes and their 2-dimensional representations as well as their transformations.

# **Writing**

In **Writing**, students will explore the different text types of fiction and non-fiction. They will identify and use the text features of different genres and follow the writing process to draft, revise, edit, and publish their work. Students will experiment with information texts, explanation, texts, letters, historical narratives, and other narrative genres.

# <u>Inquiry</u>

In **Inquiry**, students will be investigating how Australia's history has changed over time through changes in cultures, communities, and peoples. They will be developing an essential question that they wish to explore and create a presentation to discuss their findings.

# **Performing Arts**

In Performing Arts, the year 5 students will listen to, improvise, compose and perform music independently and collaboratively. They will explore rhythm, pitch, dynamics and expression by reading simple notation and composing musical pieces using the Djembe drums and African percussion instruments. Students will learn about African culture and music traditions. They will play rhythm patterns and songs, build ensemble skills, rehearse and perform to an audience. Students will replicate rhythm patterns, respond to calls, identify instruments and sound techniques and recognise layers and textures.

# **Science**

In Science, students will investigate how a shadow forms. They will determine how objects reflect, absorb and refract light, and how we use light to meet our needs. Students will independently pose questions to inform a scientific investigation and predict what the findings of an investigation might be. A particular focus will be expanding student vocabulary, thus providing students with the ability to describe in detail light, colour, reflection and refraction.

#### Physical Education

In P.E., the grade 5 Students will be focusing on the technical and tactical skills of tee-ball and netball. Through participation in team games, they will develop an understanding of the rules, tactics and strategies as well as working cooperatively with team members in these sports. They will also begin an athletics unit with a focus on learning the techniques of track and field events in the lead up to our house athletics carnival.

### **Visual Arts**

In Visual Arts, students in years 5 and 6 will explore dry-pastels and paint as mediums for colour application. They will view the artworks of Lowry, Modigliani and Kandinsky and be inspired to explore a range of techniques and processes to create their own artworks.

## Kitchen Garden

In Kitchen Garden this semester, we will be learning about the Australian Guide to Healthy Eating, the different types of fruits and vegetables, the parts of the plant they come from, the different food groups, how to prepare food, following hygiene procedures and to enjoy the food we prepare and cook. We will also be looking at how food is an important part of cultural celebrations and the impact foods from different countries have had on Australian society, and when foods from different countries were introduced.
