This means that for the first time in our school's history, we will be operating 5 Foundation classes. This is fantastic news for our school and really is something to be proud of. I would like to say thank you to all the parents and carers who have brought their Foundation child to school this week for their rostered hour over the course of the last 4 days so that our Foundation teachers; Edison Potts, Caitlin Columbus, Amy Butler, Jane O'Donnell and Danielle Ahern could conduct the Foundation interview assessment. It has been great to spend this time with your child and get to know them a little better before they officially start Foundation next week.

I would also like to welcome back our dedicated and hardworking staff team, who have ensured that all students have started the year off on a positive note. We do welcome a number of new staff to our team in 2023, so on behalf of our school community, I would like to welcome Danielle Sheedy, Caitlin Columbus, Laurence Gatt, Damiano Lo Nigro, and Tony Fraietta. Asha Cole, Cindy Sutton and Christina Christopher also re-join us in 2023 in different roles across the school. I am sure that they will all enjoy the year with us all here at Kurunjang Primary School.

As many of you also may be aware, we also had a few staff leave us at the end of 2023. Lisa Emin, Kathleen McInnes, Jua Park, Fiona Patton and Farhana Kahn. We once again thank them for their time at KPS and wish them well in the future.

As the new school year starts, I would like to remind all parents that you are welcome to contact me at any time with any feedback, questions or concerns you may have. As a parent of young children myself, I understand the challenges that sometimes present themselves at school and encourage you to either call me or pop in and see me if there is anything you would like to discuss. My door is always open and I look forward to working alongside you all during your journey here at Kurunjang Primary School.

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In some exciting news we are holding our much loved Family Fun Afternoon earlier in the year this year. It will now be held in 2 weeks' time on Wednesday 15th February from 1.40pm – 3.10pm. Please pop this date on your calendars as we would love to see you all there!

As I have spent time in classrooms throughout this week it has been AMAZING to see the calmness that is evident across the school and how well prepared everyone has been for the start of the school year. I have really enjoyed the opportunity to see all the wonderful things happening around our school this week, and have been so proud of just how well our students have settled back into school routines and expectations after the Christmas school holiday break.

From next Monday the 6th of February, we will no longer be using the gate at the back of the school between the high school and soccer oval. There are planned ground works due to happen in this area throughout February which will result in us being unable to use these gates during this time.

Parents and students will be able to access our school before and after school from one of 3 entry/exit points as follows:

- The front of the school in Mowbray Crescent
- The side of the school through the Kurunjang Community Hub
- The back of the school on Nimmo Crescent

Gates open each morning at 8.40am and will be locked after school promptly at 3.25pm as staff attend meetings after school at 3.30pm.

Please also note that due to ongoing issues and safety concerns, that secondary school students will no longer be able to store their bikes in our bike sheds or cut through our school before and after school. John Mitsinikos, Principal of Kurunjang Secondary College, will also share this information with his students and school community.

As in past years, we will be conducting our first student learning conferences for 2023 on site. The learning conferences will be conducted on Wednesday 22nd February from 11am – 7pm. Please note that students do not attend school on this day however will be required to attend their parent/teacher conference in order to be marked as present for the day. Details of the conferences, including how to book times, will be forwarded closer to the time.

We also encourage you to regularly communicate with the staff throughout the year in order to keep abreast of your child/ren's progress or share information that will assist their learning and wellbeing. If there is something that the teacher should know at the beginning of the day, please let them know while being conscious of the start of instruction time. If the information requires a longer time, please ask the teacher for a mutually agreeable time to meet before or after school. (Staff and team commitments and meetings are scheduled Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 3.30pm-4.30pm). Please contact the school via phone or COMPASS if you would like to arrange a meeting. Staff will then organise an in-person meeting or contact you by phone. Please ensure that all contact details are updated at the office as necessary.

Attached is a letter regarding the collection, use, disclosure and storing of student data and parent personal information in the school environment and within the Privacy and Data Protection Act. Please take time to familiarise yourself of the information provided in the School's Privacy and Collection statement.

I also encourage you to make sure that you have the Compass app on your phone and that you are able to log in to this app with your log in details. Existing families are able to update their personal details via this app and keep abreast of school events etc. Ongoing electronic reporting of your child's progress will be made on COMPASS. The semester 1 and 2 academic reports are also forwarded electronically via COMPASS. Since 2018, reports are no longer issued in hard copy. All parents and carers are able to access the unit overviews in Maths, English and Inquiry and receive regular progress assessments of their child/ren throughout the year in addition to the end of semester reports, via COMPASS. It is imperative that all parents are on COMPASS so please ensure that you have returned the return slip if you have not done so previously, in order to receive your personalised login details. If you need assistance in installing the COMPASS app, please contact the school on 9743 0633 as unfortunately we are unable to offer our usual training sessions on site for parents/carers.

As has been the case for the last 2 years student assemblies are conducted at 2.30pm on Friday afternoons, alternating each week between years F-2 and 3-6, due to the number of students and size of Kurunjang's gym. We are so excited to announce that in 2023, parents who are available or who would like to attend assembly are now welcome to attend each week and join our children and staff in the gym for their respective assemblies. Parents are invited to attend our assemblies from Friday 17th of February.

I am sure that many of you are aware that COVID-19 continues to remain an ongoing issue in our community. Our school will continue to adhere to the Department of Health's recommendations to ensure that our school remains a safe environment for our staff and students. The Department of Health strongly recommends that students and school staff:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days and do not attend school after 5 days if they are still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive not attend school. This does not include students with pre-existing conditions such as hay fever.
- Parents and carers are recommended to continue to report their child having COVID-19 to both the school and the Department of Health.

We will, however, no longer report occurrences of positive cases to the school community.

We ask parents and carers to continue to remain vigilant in preventing COVID-19 transmission. Any student who is unwell should continue to remain at home. This is about keeping students healthy and well in our school and reducing the spread of both COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases.

Parents and carers will be contacted if their child shows symptoms while at school.

Students who wish to wear a mask should continue to do so. To keep our school as safe as possible, we will also continue to use air purifiers and other COVID-19 prevention measures. We thank you for your continued efforts to keep our school community safe and well.

After such a fabulous start to the school year, we are very much looking forward to a fantastic year of fun and learning ahead! APPLICATIONS FOR CSEF CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND FOR NEW STUDENTS/FAMILIES

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless you have additional children attending school this year or there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time at Kurunjang Primary School, please come into the school office to collect an application form.

Please check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible

NOTIFICATION AND APPROVAL REGARDING EXTENDED ABSENCES FOR FAMILY HOLIDAYS OR EVENTS

We appreciate that families from time to time may be absent for family holidays or events. In the event that you know you will be absent please come to the office to collect a notification regarding extended absences for family holidays or events form for approval. This will enable the class and specialist teachers to be aware of the absence and for the absence to be recorded on compass

WEARING OF SCHOOL HATS

Please note that the wearing of school hats is compulsory in Terms 1 & 4. Please make sure your child has a Kurunjang Primary School projected hat for Term 1. School hats are only available from

Kurunjang Primary School is committed to being a child safe organisation and embedding a child safe culture into our practices and processes to ensure all children who attend the school are safe at all times.

Statement of Commitment to Child Safety

We want children to be safe, happy and empowered. We support and respect all children, as well as our staff, volunteers and the parent community.

- We are committed to the cultural safety of Aboriginal children, to the cultural safety of children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, and to providing a safe environment for vulnerable and children with a disability.
- We have zero tolerance of child abuse, and all allegations and safety concerns will be treated very seriously.
- We have legal and moral obligations to contact authorities when we are worried about a child's safety, which we follow rigorously.
- Our school is committed to preventing child abuse and identifying risks early, and removing and reducing these risks.
- Our school human resources and recruitment practices for all staff and volunteers are within DET requirements and practices.
- Our school is committed to regularly training and educating our staff and volunteers on child abuse risks.
- We have specific policies, procedures and training in place that support our leadership team, staff and volunteers to achieve these commitments in a consistent manner.
- The school's Child Safe policy will be publicly available to help raise awareness about the importance of child safety in our organisation and demonstrate our commitment to protecting children from abuse.

Kurunjang Primary School will:

- 1. Take a preventative, proactive and participatory approach to child safety;
- 2. Value and empower children to participate in decisions which affect their lives;
- 3. Foster a culture of openness that supports all persons to safely disclose risks of harm to children;

- 4. Respect diversity in cultures and child rearing practices while keeping child safety paramount;
- 5. Provide written guidance on appropriate conduct and behaviour towards children;
- 6. Engage only the most suitable people to work with children and have high quality staff and volunteer supervision and professional development;
- 7. Ensure children know who to talk with if they are worried or are feeling unsafe, and that they are comfortable and encouraged to raise such issues;
- 8. Report suspected abuse, neglect or mistreatment promptly to the appropriate authorities;
- 9. Share information appropriately and lawfully with other organisations where the safety and wellbeing of children is at risk; and
- 10. Value the input of and communicate regularly with families and carers.

Privacy Collection Notice

Information for students, parents and carers

The Department of Education and Training (the Department) values your privacy and is committed to protecting the personal and health information that schools collect.

All school staff must comply with Victorian privacy law and the <u>Schools' Privacy Policy</u>. This notice explains how the Department, including Victorian government schools (schools), handles personal and health information. On occasion, specific consent will be sought for the collection and use of information, for example, for a student to receive a health service. Our schools are also required by legislation, such as the *Education and Training Reform Act 2006*, to collect some of this information.

Throughout this notice, 'staff' includes principals, teachers, student support service officers, youth workers, social workers, nurses and any other allied health practitioners, and all other employees, contractors, volunteers and service providers of the school and the Department.

On enrolment, and during the ordinary course of a student's attendance at a school, schools will collect information about students and their families for the following purposes:

- educating students
- supporting students' social and emotional wellbeing, and health
- fulfilling legal obligations, including duty of care, anti-discrimination law and occupational health and safety law
- communicating and engaging with parents
- student administration
- school management
- supporting policy in relation to student education and wellbeing.

If this information is not collected, schools may be unable to provide optimal education or support to students or fulfil legal obligations.

For example, our schools rely on parents to provide **health information** about any medical condition or disability that their child has, medication their child may take while at school, any known allergies and contact details of their child's doctor. If parents do not provide all relevant health information, this may put their child's health at risk.

Our schools also require current, relevant information about all **parents and carers** so that schools can take account of safety concerns that affect their children. Parents should provide schools with copies of all current parenting plans and court orders about or that affect their children and provide updated copies when they change.

When parents enrol their child in primary school, they will be asked to provide personal and health information in several ways, including via the Enrolment Form, the <u>School Entrance Health Questionnaire</u> (SEHQ) and the <u>Early Childhood Intervention Service</u> (ECIS) Transition Form.

The **Enrolment Form** is used to collect information that is essential for the purposes listed above, and requests information such as:

- Emergency contacts Individuals parents nominate for a school to contact during an emergency. Parents should ensure that their nominated emergency contact agrees to their contact details being provided to the school and that they understand their details may be disclosed by the Department if lawful, e.g. in the case of emergency communications relating to bush fires or floods.
- Student background information Information about country of birth, Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin, language spoken at home and parent occupation. This information enables the Department to allocate appropriate resources to schools. The Department also uses this information to plan for future educational needs in Victoria and shares some information with the Commonwealth government to monitor, plan and allocate resources.
- Immunisation status This assists schools to manage health risks and legal obligations. The Department may also provide this information to the Department of Health and Department of Families, Fairness and Housing to assess immunisation rates in Victoria, but not in a way which identifies students.
- Visa status This is required to process a student's enrolment.

All schools may use departmental systems and online tools such as apps and other software to effectively collect and manage information about students and families for the purposes listed above.

When schools use these online tools, they take steps to ensure that student information is secure. If parents or carers have any concerns about the use of these online tools, please contact the school.

School staff will only share student and family information with other school staff who need to know to enable them to educate or support the student as described above. Information will only be shared outside the school (and outside the Department) as required or authorised by law, including where sharing is required to meet duty of care, anti-discrimination, occupational health and safety, and child wellbeing and safety obligations. The information collected will not be disclosed beyond the school and Department without parent consent unless such disclosure is lawful.

When a student transfers to another school (including Catholic, independent and interstate), personal and/or health information about that student may be transferred to the next school. Transferring this information is in the best interests of the student and assists the next school to provide the best possible education and support to the student. For further detail about how and what level of information is provided to the next school, refer to the: Enrolment: Student transfers between schools

Schools only provide school reports and ordinary school communications to students, parents, carers or others who have a legal right to that information. Requests for access to other student information or by others must be made by lodging a Freedom of Information (FOI) application.

To update student or family information, parents should contact their school.




