PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

How fantastic was our Family Fun Afternoon on Wednesday? It was so great to see so many parents and carers at our school and enjoying a picnic lunch and some fun activities with their child. It is always a highlight of our year, and I know that our staff team really enjoyed the opportunity to have some fun with our students and meet some of their parents and carers. Thank you to each and every one of you that found the time to come and spend the afternoon with us on Wednesday.

As always is the case in schools, we have a number of key dates and events happening throughout term 1. To help with your planning for the term ahead, here are some important dates for you to put in your diaries or on your calendars:

- Thursday 6th April: F-2 Easter Bonnet Parade
- Thursday 6th April: End term 1 2.10pm finish

A reminder to all families that our term 1 parent/teacher/student conferences will be held on Wednesday the 22nd of February. This will be a student free day and students will be marked as in attendance if they come in for their allocated Parent/Teacher interview time. Please mark this date on your calendars as students do not attend school as usual on this day. Bookings are now open and we do encourage you to pop onto Compass and book a time to meet with your child's teacher.

As mentioned last week, we will be sharing with you more information about our Child Safe standards in the newsletter each week. This week, we are looking at Child Safe standard 1, which is to Establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued. This is a new standard that requires schools to make sure Aboriginal children and young people feel safe. This standard applies to all schools, even if there are no students who have identified themselves as Aboriginal.

The term 'Aboriginal' includes Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. It is important to be respectful of how individual children, students, their families and community refer to themselves, and use appropriate language. Cultural safety includes being provided with a safe, nurturing and positive environment where Aboriginal children:

- feel comfortable being themselves
- feel comfortable expressing their culture, including their spiritual and belief systems
- are supported by carers who respect their Aboriginality and encourage their sense of self and identity.

At Kurunjang Primary School, we implement and demonstrate this standard by valuing and respecting the different cultures of all our staff, students and families, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

We have had an increase in the number of dogs coming into the school both before and after school. It is our policy that any dogs on the school grounds must be on a lead and restrained at all times. We have also, on a couple of occasions had to pick up dog poo from our grounds. If you are bringing a dog into our school it is an expectation that you clean up after it please, as it is not nice for our staff or students to come across this throughout the day.

A reminder to all families that are eligible that now is the time to apply for CSEF payments. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless you have additional children attending school this year or there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time at Kurunjang Primary School, please come into the school office to collect an application form.

Kurunjang Primary School is committed to being a child safe organisation and embedding a child safe culture into our practices and processes to ensure all children who attend the school are safe at all times.

Please check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

Starting next week, we are going to be introducing Compass Positive Observation notifications to parents. What this means is that when your child receives a wrist band or is observed displaying one of our school values, you will receive a Compass notification via email which will alert you to this positive observation, and prompt you to have a follow up conversation with your child and really celebrate the great things they are doing at school. As behaviour continues to improve across the school, we really want to acknowledge and celebrate the great things our students are doing.

Since the beginning of the year, we have had an increase in students wearing smartwatches to school. Any smart watch that has the capacity to make or receive calls and/or text messages are classed as a personal communication device and are covered by our mobile phone policy. Any student wearing a smartwatch is expected to have their watch on school mode during school hours or otherwise hand their watch into the office at the beginning of the day where it will be stored securely until the end of the day where our students can collect their watches from the office. We will be following up with any student who isn't following our mobile phone policy and contacting parents throughout the week.

With the number of cooler days we have had so far in term 1, we have certainly noticed a number of students coming in to school with a hot drink in hand, such as a hot chocolate either in a disposable coffee cup or in a thermos. While we completely understand why a hot drink might be nice on a cool morning, we do ask that these drinks are saved for home use only as they pose a potential safety risk for our students. We really do appreciate your support in helping us to keep our students and school community safe!

A reminder for all parents to order your photos online as per the instructions that were sent out to families over the last couple of weeks. If you are ordering using an envelope, please have envelopes ready to bring to school with your child on photo day which is Wednesday the 1st of March. If you have any questions about how to order your child's school photos, please don't hesitate to contact the office on 9743 0633.

Breakfast club is back up and running in 2023 which is fantastic news for our school. Breakfast club will operate on Monday and Friday mornings in term 1, and all students are welcome to attend. Breakfast club is held in the community hub next door to our school so students can enter breakfast club through the kitchen garden gates. We love having students attend our breakfast club and look forward to seeing you there!





Please Note: If you miss photo day, portrait and group packages can still be ordered online for 7 days afterwards with no late fees. After that time, late orders will require separate processing and handling and therefore will incur a \$15 late fee per package.

PURPOSE

To explain to our school community the Department's and Kurunjang Primary School's policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones and other personal mobile devices during school hours.

SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- 1. All students at Kurunjang Primary School and,
- Students' personal mobile phones and other personal mobile devices brought onto school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime.

DEFINITIONS

A mobile phone is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to mobile phones and any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as smart watches."

POLICY

Kurunjang Primary School understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

At Kurunjang Primary School:

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information)
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school's office.

Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Kurunjang Primary School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Kurunjang Primary school are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Kurunjang Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Refer to the Kurunjang Primary School's Personal Property Policy AND/OR the Department's <u>Claims for Property Damage and Medical Expenses policy</u>.

Where Students bring a mobile phone to school, Kurunjang Primary school will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Kurunjang Primary school students are required to hand into the school administration office to be placed in a lockable cupboard etc.

Enforcement

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at Kurunjang Primary school may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing Student Wellbeing and Engagement and/or Code of Conduct or Bullying policies.

At Kurunjang Primary School inappropriate use of mobile phones is any use during school hours, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls

- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- · to capture video or images in the school toilets, and gyms
- during assessments

Exceptions

Exceptions to the policy:

- may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
 - Health and wellbeing-related exceptions; and
 - Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.
- can be granted by the Principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u>.

The three categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's <u>Mobile Phones</u>
<u>— Student Use Policy</u> are:

1. Learning-related exceptions
