#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

One of my most favourite times of the school year both as a parent and a teacher would have to be Parent/Teacher conferences. This week's conferences at KPS were absolutely no different and it was great to see lots of parents and carers making the time to come in and meet their child's 2023 teacher. A huge thankyou to everyone who came in, and of course to our teaching staff who altered their hours of attendance today to provide the best possible opportunity for our parents and carers to find a suitable time to pop in for a chat.

As always is the case in schools, we still have a number of key dates and events happening throughout term 1. To help with your planning for the term ahead, here are some important dates for you to put in your diaries or on your calendars:

In some exciting news for our school, next Wednesday the 1st of March our Area Regional Director, Bronwen Heathfield, will be visiting our school to see all the great things we have happening here at KPS! Whilst here, Bronwen will meet some of our staff and will visit some of our classrooms to share in all the great work we have been doing here at Kurunjang Primary over the past 12 months.

As many of you are now aware, we had to make the difficult decision to ban Pokemon cards at our school. Pokemon cards at school have been causing a distraction in class, and also causing some minor issues between students, for example there have been a number of arguments over unfair trading etc. The ban will ensure the cards are no longer a distraction for students in class and will also stop arguments and the unfair trading that is causing some distress to some of our students at the moment. We are incredibly grateful for all the parent and carer support we have had this week in making sure that Pokemon cards are not coming to school.

In approximately 3 weeks time our grade 3 and grade 5 students will participate in the annual NAPLAN assessments. In 2023, the NAPLAN assessments are happening earlier than usual and all students across Australia in grades 3 and 5 will complete these assessments from the 15th of March. As has been the case in earlier years, parents and carers have the option to exempt their

child from this year's NAPLAN assessments and can do so by contacting the school. We can then send home the required paperwork for you to complete. We do though encourage all our students to participate as these assessments give us valuable data that we can then use to provide point of need teaching and learning for your child.

Do you want to help make decisions and contribute to conversations to ensure Kurunjang Primary School can be the best school it can be? It is that time of year again when we call for school council nominations from our parent community. In 2023, we have 3 parent vacancies on school council.

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school. In doing this, a school council can directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Our School Council meets once a month to discuss matters relating to school programs, budgets, resourcing, and policies. You don't need to have any experience – just a passion for making the school be the best it can be! There is training available, and we have experienced parents to support you along the way.

If you would like to nominate yourself or another parent (with their permission) to be a parent representative on School Council, please contact the school office and we will send a nomination form home with your child. Once the nomination form is completed, please return it to the office.

Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, voting will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed. If there are the same number of nominations as positions, voting will not be needed. For further information, please feel free to contact either myself or the school office. Nominations will open Friday 24th of February and will close a week later, Friday 3rd of March at 4pm.

As we settle in the school year, it is really important that students attend school regularly and that strong attendance habits are set early in the school year. Here is some important information you may find helpful in establishing strong attendance behaviours in 2023:

Did you know?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read

- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks
- · Being late to school may lead to poor attendance
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in Foundation so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, tertiary education and at work So, what you can do?

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Don't let your child stay home unless they are truly sick
- Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, our wellbeing team, or other parents for advice on how to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbour, or another parent
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session

As mentioned earlier in the term, we will be sharing with you more information about our Child Safe standards in the newsletter each week. This week, we are looking at Child Safe standard 2, which is to Ensure that child safety and wellbeing are embedded in school leadership, governance and culture. This standard emphasises the vital role that school leaders and governing authorities have in establishing:

- · a culture where child abuse and harm are not tolerated
- effective systems and processes to implement child safe policies and practices and manage child abuse risks.

Schools must take deliberate steps to promote child safety and wellbeing and protect children by

- embedding and promoting a child safety culture at all levels of the organisation
- school leaders actively modelling such a culture
- ensuring transparent governance arrangements.

At Kurunjang Primary School, we implement and demonstrate this standard through developing, endorsing and making publicly available a:

- Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy
- Child Safety Code of Conduct

We also make sure that all school staff and volunteers understand our Child Safe Standards and their obligations regarding Child Safe information sharing and recordkeeping.

A reminder for all parents to order your photos online as per the instructions that were sent out to families over the last couple of weeks. If you are ordering using an envelope, please have envelopes ready to bring to school with your child on photo day which is Wednesday the 1st of March. ## APPLICATIONS FOR CSEF CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND FOR NEW STUDENTS/FAMILIES

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless you have additional children attending school this year or there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time at Kurunjang Primary School, please come into the school office to collect an application form.

Please check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

#### WEARING OF SCHOOL HATS

Please note that the wearing of school hats is compulsory in Terms 1 & 4. Please make sure your child has a Kurunjang Primary School embroidered hat for Term 1. School hats

are only available from Buxwear, Bakery Square Melton.

#### STUDENT MEDICATIONS FORMS

#### Enrolling into Secondary School


State Secondary Schools in Melton work closely together to provide each and every student in our schools with an enriched and positive experience. We pride ourselves in the quality education we provide.

### NAPLAN 2023 and Ramadan

In 2023, NAPLAN testing starts on 15 March and ends on 27 March. This overlaps with the beginning of the Islamic holy month of Ramadan, which is expected to begin on 22 March 2023. Muslims may observe the period by fasting from food and drink from sunrise to sunset, with a focus on devotion and spiritual contemplation.

NAPLAN testing dates are established in consultation with state, territory and federal authorities, accommodating different term dates in all states and territories. As Ramadan's commencement date changes each year and has a duration of one month, it may at times fall during INAPLAN.

During the NAPLAN testing period, what support can schools, parents and carers provide for students who are observing Ramadan?

Following consultation with Islamic schools' representatives, the following information and guidance is provided for schools, parents and carers in offering support to students observing Ramadan and undertaking NAPLAN:

- Parents and carers should discuss any concerns with their child's school to identify what support measures are available, including with scheduling tests.
- At the beginning of Ramadan, many families and students may be getting into the rhythm of fasting, as well as rising before dawn, and may be more tired than usual. Schools are encouraged to schedule tests as soon as possible within the test window, prioritising scheduling in week 1 over week 2, when Ramadan commences. If test sessions will be run between 22 and 27 March, schools with Muslim students can schedule NAPLAN tests first thing in the morning to ensure fasting students' energy levels are at their highest.

#### What happens if a child is absent from school on test days?

All students are encouraged to participate in NAPLAN tests. Where possible, schools will organise for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the school's test schedule.

#### What happens if a school is closed on test days?

Schools that will be closed during testing days and who need to vary their NAPLAN test schedule must request permission from their local test administration authority. Schools have the flexibility of the 9-day test window and, if required, the 4-day security period to schedule NAPLAN tests.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a nationwide measure to see whether or not young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning, and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.




