PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Can you believe that at the end of this week we are halfway through Term 1? I guess the saying is true that time really does fly when you are having fun! As we do near the halfway point of Term 1, I would like to take the opportunity to really acknowledge and thank our students, staff and school community for the incredibly positive start that we have had to the 2023 school year, and really celebrate the wonderful start to the year we have had. I have been so incredibly proud of all our students for their efforts over the past 5 weeks and have been so pleased with how positively they have gone about their learning during this time. I would also like to acknowledge all our students for their behaviour both inside and outside the classroom, which really has been outstanding and does highlight just how far our students have come over the past 12 months.

As always is the case in schools, we still have a number of key dates and events happening throughout Term 1. To help with your planning for the term ahead, here are some important dates for you to put in your diaries or on your calendars:

- Monday 13th March Labour Day Public Holiday
- Wednesday 15th March Friday 24th March: 2023 NAPLAN assessment period
- Monday 20th March Thursday 30th March: Grade 2 swimming program
- Thursday 6th April: F-2 Easter Bonnet Parade
- Thursday 6th April: End term 1 2.10pm finish

In approximately 2 weeks' time our grade 3 and grade 5 students will participate in the annual NAPLAN assessments. In 2023, the NAPLAN assessments are happening earlier than usual and all students across Australia in grades 3 and 5 will complete these assessments from the 15th of March. As has been the case in earlier years, parents and carers have the option to exempt their child from this year's NAPLAN assessments and can do so by contacting the school. Exemptions need to be made no later than Monday 6th of March so that they can be processed please. We can then send home the required paperwork for you to complete. We do though encourage all our students to participate as these assessments give us valuable data that we can then use to provide point of need teaching and learning for your child.

In 2023, Kurunjang Primary School is joining with the Resilience Project to help us support our students through the delivery of an emotionally engaging program that provides practical, evidence-based mental health strategies to build resilience and happiness in all students. The program content focuses on the

key pillars to resilience: Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness. These are evidence-based strategies that are shown to build positive mental health. With regular practise they increase learning capacity, emotional literacy, physical health and happiness. Definitions for each of these strategies are below:

- Gratitude is paying attention to what you have as opposed to focusing on the lack of something. It's about being thankful for the little things in life and acknowledging what went well for you.
- Empathy is the ability to understand another person's thoughts and feelings from their perspective. Closely linked with kindness, empathy is about actively looking for opportunities to be there for other people.
- Mindfulness is about being in the present moment. It builds a sense of clarity and calm, and can be practised through breathing exercises, meditation and paying attention to feelings and senses.

We have been advised by parents in our community that the parking inspectors are regularly out and about fining people both before and after school, especially at the back of our school in Nimmo Crescent. We therefore do ask parents to be extra vigilant in this area and to make sure that you are not only taking extra care and caution out there, but that you are also parking legally at all times to avoid being fined.

It has been great to see the number of students walking and riding to and from school each day and the efforts they are making to travel safely when crossing roads. Unfortunately, we have noticed an increase in students not wearing helmets though when riding either a bike or scooter to school. In all Australian states and territories, helmets are compulsory for riding bikes. In some states, helmets are also compulsory when riding skateboards, scooters, rollerblades and so on.

Wearing a helmet is always recommended when your child is riding any wheeled device, even if it isn't required by law. A helmet is an essential part of protecting your child against serious head injuries.

Kurunjang Primary School is committed to being a child safe organisation and embedding a child safe culture into our practices and processes to ensure all children who attend the school are safe at all times.

Here are tips for finding the safest helmet for bikes and scooters:

- Make sure that the helmet is made to Australian/New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 2063:2008. Look for the Australian Standards label.
- Take your child with you when buying a helmet to make sure it's properly fitted.
- Do the 'push test' to make sure the helmet is a snug fit. If you can push the helmet backwards, forwards or sideways once you've done up the clips, it's too big.
- Make sure the helmet isn't damaged. For example, check that there are no cracks and that the foam liner is intact.
- Don't buy a second-hand helmet there's no way of knowing if the previous owner has damaged it in an accident.
- Always replace helmets after an impact.
- When your child is wearing a bike, scooter or skateboarding helmet, the chinstrap should always be firmly fastened and not twisted.
- When children get off their bikes, scooters or skateboards, they should always remove their helmets. Helmets can be choking hazards if children are doing activities other than riding.

Please help us keep our students safe as they travel to and from my school by making sure they wear a helmet when using any wheeled device.

A reminder that it is that time of year again when we call for School Council nominations from our parent community. In 2023, we have 3 parent vacancies on School Council.

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school. In doing this, a school council can directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Our School Council meets once a month to discuss matters relating to school programs, budgets, resourcing, and policies. You don't need to have any experience – just a passion for making the school be the best it can be! There is training available, and we have experienced parents to support you along the way.

If you would like to nominate yourself or another parent (with their permission) to be a parent representative on School Council, please contact the school office and we will send a nomination form whom with your child. Once the nomination form is completed, please return it to the office.

Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, voting will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed. If there are the same number of nominations as positions, voting will not be needed. For further information, please feel free to contact either myself or the school office. Nominations are now open and will close TOMORROW Friday 3rd of March at 4pm.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, we will be sharing with you more information about our Child Safe standards in the newsletter each week. This week, we are looking at Child Safe standard 3, which is Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.

This standard supports schools to create a culture that values and promotes student participation. This includes:

- informing students about their rights and responsibilities in an age-appropriate way
- recognising the importance of friendships and peer support
- enabling students to actively participate in creating a culture that is safe for them and their peers.

At Kurunjang Primary School, we implement and demonstrate this standard by teaching our students about their rights and responsibilities and supporting them to create a culture that is safe, orderly and enjoyable for all.

NAPLAN 2023 and Ramadan

In 2023, NAPLAN testing starts on 15 March and ends on 27 March. This overlaps with the beginning of the Islamic holy month of Ramadan, which is expected to begin on 22 March 2023. Muslims may observe the period by fasting from food and drink from sunrise to sunset, with a focus on devotion and spiritual contemplation.

NAPLAN testing dates are established in consultation with state, territory and federal authorities, accommodating different term dates in all states and territories. As Ramadan's commencement date changes each year and has a duration of one month, it may at times fall during INAPLAN.

During the NAPLAN testing period, what support can schools, parents and carers provide for students who are observing Ramadan?

Following consultation with Islamic schools' representatives, the following information and guidance is provided for schools, parents and carers in offering support to students observing Ramadan and undertaking NAPLAN:

- Parents and carers should discuss any concerns with their child's school to identify what support measures are available, including with scheduling tests.
- At the beginning of Ramadan, many families and students may be getting into the rhythm of fasting, as well as rising before dawn, and may be more tired than usual. Schools are encouraged to schedule tests as soon as possible within the test window, prioritising scheduling in week 1 over week 2, when Ramadan commences. If test sessions will be run between 22 and 27 March, schools with Muslim students can schedule NAPLAN tests first thing in the morning to ensure fasting students' energy levels are at their highest.

What happens if a child is absent from school on test days?

All students are encouraged to participate in NAPLAN tests. Where possible, schools will organise for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the school's test schedule.

What happens if a school is closed on test days?

Schools that will be closed during testing days and who need to vary their NAPLAN test schedule must request permission from their local test administration authority. Schools have the flexibility of the 9-day test window and, if required, the 4-day security period to schedule NAPLAN tests.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a nationwide measure to see whether or not young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning, and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.

Enrolling into Secondary School


State Secondary Schools in Melton work closely together to provide each and every student in our schools with an enriched and positive experience. We pride ourselves in the quality education we provide.



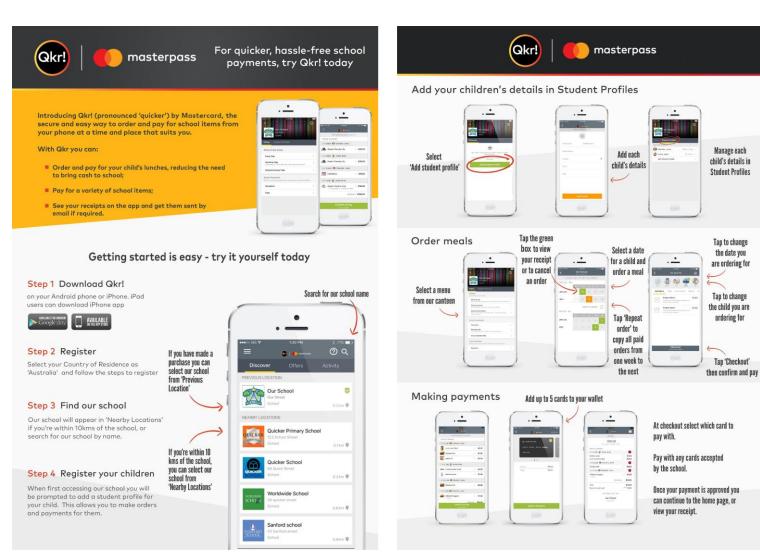
