PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

We have had another great week here at Kurunjang Primary School! Students have continued to settle really well into the school routines including our Foundation students who are slowly understanding what school is about and are also feeling very tired. The school grounds are full of laughing students, lots of conversation and happy and smiling students. We are really enjoying seeing the students so happy and engaged here at KPS!

As always is the case in schools, we still have a number of key dates and events happening throughout term 1. To help with your planning for the term ahead, here are some important dates for you to put in your diaries or on your calendars:

As mentioned above, this weekend is a long weekend for students and staff at Kurunjang Primary School. As Monday is Labour Day, this means that students and staff do not attend school on Monday. We hope that everybody enjoys the opportunity to have some extra rest and relaxation this weekend.

The families and community members that live next to or opposite our school have raised some concerns about the rubbish being left on their nature strips by parents and students either before or after school. They have asked that we ask our parents, students and wider school community to be mindful about dropping or leaving rubbish on drop off and pick up and ask that you all take any rubbish home with you to dispose of it there. Your help and support with this issue would be greatly appreciated.

Next week our students in grades 3 and 5 will participate in the annual NAPLAN assessments. These assessments occur over 2 weeks and assess student performance in the areas of Numeracy, Reading, Writing, and Language Conventions. This can be an anxious time for some students, so if you do notice your child becoming anxious about these assessments, please notify myself or your child's teacher so that we can provide some additional support and reassurance in the lead up to your child's participation.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

A reminder that DET does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools. Principals have been requested to remind students and parents/guardians of this at the beginning of each academic year and to discourage parents/students from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school. Please, try and avoid bringing these items as it can be most upsetting for all concerned if items go missing or are damaged.

Many of you may have noticed that we now have staff on duty at the front and rear of our school both before and after school. This is to assist students to safely find their parents at the end of the day and to support them with crossing the road if required. This increased presence has meant that we now have an increased awareness of some of the risky behaviours our students and parents sometime display. Can we please ask all parents and carers to speak with their child/ren about the safe crossing of roads and remind them to cross with caution and not dart out from between parked cars.

School communities have demonstrated incredible resilience over the COVID-19 pandemic, through a stressful and challenging time. It is important for everyone to be respectful and kind to each other. The Department of Education have released a policy entitled Respectful Behaviours within the School Community. Good relationships are based on respect and the types of behaviours that will not be tolerated which include threats, harassment and rudeness. Our staff work very hard to provide the best social, emotional and academic environment for your child. Please remember that we are human too and deserve to be treated with respect. As mentioned in previous newsletters, we will be sharing with you more information about our Child Safe standards in the newsletter each week. This week, we are looking at Child Safe standard 4, which is Family Engagement.

This standard highlights the importance of an open and transparent child safe culture for families and communities. Schools must provide families and communities with accessible information about their child safe policies and practices and involve them in their approach to child safety and wellbeing.

Kurunjang Primary School is committed to being a child safe organisation and embedding a child safe culture into our practices and processes to ensure all children who attend the school are safe at all times.



PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

To comply with this standard at Kurunjang Primary School, we:

- make sure families participate in child safety and wellbeing decisions which affect their child
- engage and openly communicate with families and the school community about its child safe approach
- make child safety information accessible
- involve families and the school community in developing and reviewing child safety and wellbeing policies and practices
- inform families and carers about the school's governance and approach to child safety and wellbeing, including roles and responsibilities of school staff.

It has come to our attention that some students in the school may have head lice and we seek your cooperation in checking your child's hair this week. Head lice do not transmit infectious diseases – they are transmitted by having head to head contact with someone who has head lice. You may be reassured to know that head lice are commonly found in places other than at Kurunjang Primary School. Head lice are common in school-aged children and are the most adaptable of creatures. They have survived living solely on humans for 10,000 years!!!!

So, what can you do?

I seek your cooperation in checking your child's hair and in those instances where head lice or eggs are found, treating your child's hair. Please visit www.betterhealth.vic.gov.au and search for "head lice (nits)" for advice on finding, treating and preventing head lice. If head lice or eggs are found on your child's hair you need to inform:

- the school and advise when the treatment has started
- parents or carers of your child's friends so they too have the opportunity to detect and treat their children if necessary.

When can my child return to school?

Health regulations require that where a child has head lice, that child should not return to school until the day after appropriate treatment has started. Please note, this refers only to those children who have live head lice and does not refer to head lice eggs. More information about exclusion requirements can be found by searching for "school exclusion table" at www.health.vic.gov.au. Here at Kurunjang Primary School, we are aware that head lice can be a sensitive issue and are committed to maintaining your confidentiality.

Parents can ring 8746 2142 to make an appointment or at this time of year as it is quieter, they can come in without an appointment.

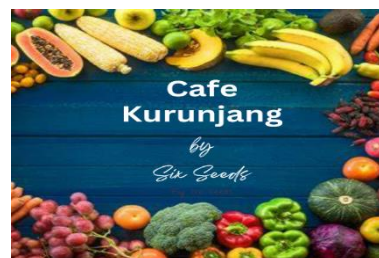


WEARING OF SCHOOL HATS

APPLICATIONS FOR CSEF CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND FOR NEW STUDENTS/FAMILIES

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless you have additional children attending school this year or there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time at Kurunjang Primary School, please come into the school office to collect an application form.

Please check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

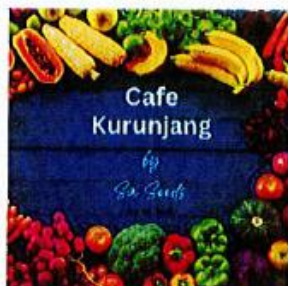

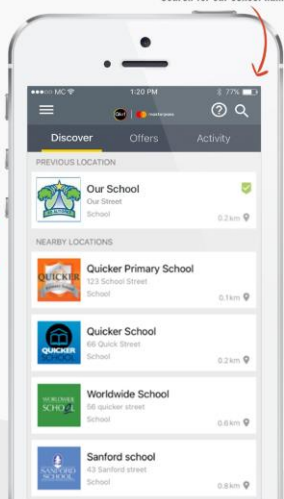
