PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I hope that you have all had a great week and that you enjoyed the long weekend last weekend. This week does feel like it has flown by which is one of the benefits of having a long weekend earlier in the week. This week, our Grade 3 and 5 students have begun their 2023 NAPLAN assessments having completed their Writing assessment on Wednesday and their Reading assessment earlier today. I have been so proud of the way in which our Grade 3 and 5 students have approached these assessments so positively, and how they really have tried hard to do their very best! On behalf of us all, I would like to congratulate every student who has participated in NAPLAN this week and wish them all the very best as they participate in the Numeracy and Language Convention assessments next week.

As the weather has begun to cool down and we have had some cooler mornings, we have seen an increase in students wearing their school jumpers to school which is great. Unfortunately though, this has already resulted in an increase of jumpers appearing in lost property. Can I please ask that everyone takes a minute to clearly label your child's school jumper as you pull it out of the cupboard again and before your child starts wearing it to school, as this will mean that if your child does lose or misplace their jumper, it is far more likely that we will find it and be able to return it to you.

Next Tuesday is Harmony Day and students across our school will be learning about and participating in some different activities throughout the week. Harmony Day is a day to celebrate Australian multiculturalism, based on the successful integration of migrants into our community. Harmony Day is about inclusiveness, respect and belonging for all Australians, regardless of cultural or linguistic background, united by a set of core Australian values. Held every year on 21st March, the Day coincides with the United Nations International Day for the

Elimination of Racial Discrimination. Since 1999, more than 70,000 Harmony Day events have been held in childcare centres, schools, community groups, churches, businesses and Federal, State and Local Government agencies across Australia. To participate, you can wear orange to show your support, or you can attend a community Harmony Week event.

We still have 3 School Council parent vacancies available for 2023 and are looking for parents who may wish to join our dedicated School Council and help shape our school in 2023. All government schools in Victoria have a School Council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school. In doing this, a School Council can directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Our School Council meets once a month to discuss matters relating to school programs, budgets, resourcing, and policies. You don't need to have any experience – just a passion for making the school be the best it can be! There is training available, and we have experienced parents to support you along the way. If this sounds like something you may be interested in, please don't hesitate to contact me or pop in and see me and we can discuss this opportunity and what is involved in a little more detail.

Our 2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM) will be held next Tuesday 21st of March at the school at 5pm. This meeting goes for no longer than 30 minutes and is where we present the 2022 annual report and elect our School Council office bearers for the 2023 school year. The AGM is an open meeting and any school community member is welcome to attend. If you are planning on attending, can you please let me know by sending me a brief email to maree.moyle@education.vic.gov.au so we know to expect you.

Every 4 years all schools participate in what is known as a school review. During this review, a school reflects upon the goals and targets it set 4 years ago in the last strategic plan and assesses it's performance in order to identify the next steps in the school's improvement plan, and also to help guide the development of the next 4 year strategic plan. Our school review will be taking place during term 4. Part of the pre-review work involves writing a pre-review self-evaluation, and this is where we need your help. A key component of this self-review is providing an opportunity for parents to share their opinions on our school, including what is working well as well as some areas for improvement. So, in order to provide you with an opportunity for feedback, we will be holding some parent forums in the terms ahead to give you an opportunity to provide some feedback.

Kurunjang Primary School is committed to being a child safe organisation and embedding a child safe culture into our practices and processes to ensure all children who attend the school are safe at all times.

During these forums, you will be provided with some prompts and key talking points and can chat with us about your thoughts and opinions. Your feedback is welcomed and valued, so please keep an eye out for further information in the months ahead.

In 2023, we are once again running our much loved Easter raffle and are now calling for donations of Easter Eggs to be included in the raffle prizes. Last year, the Easter raffle was a very successful fundraising event and we were able to hand out a number of prizes. If you can and would like to donate to this year's Easter raffle, please either drop your donations off to the office or send them in with your child who can give them to the office. Your donations are very much appreciated as is your support of our 2023 Easter raffle.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, we will be sharing with you more information about our Child Safe standards in the newsletter each week. This week, we are looking at Child Safe standard 5, which is Diversity and Equity.

This standard focuses on creating environments where all children and young people feel welcome.

Equity is a state of fairness in which all children and young people can participate freely and equally in areas of life, regardless of their background, characteristics or beliefs. This means their safety is not dependent on their socio-economic, family or personal circumstances.

To comply with this standard at Kurunjang Primary School, we:

- recognise and respond to students' diverse circumstances.
- understand that some students are at higher risk of harm than others.
- provide easy access to information.
- adjust procedures to respond to different needs.
- make sure complaints processes are child-friendly, culturally safe and easy to understand.

Children have better opportunities to fulfil their potential when diversity is valued. Negative experiences like exclusion and discrimination can be harmful. They increase the risk of harm and abuse to a child and decrease the likelihood of them telling someone and receiving an effective response.

Upholding equity and respecting diverse needs are relevant in implementing all the Child Safe Standards.

APPLICATIONS FOR CSEF CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND FOR NEW STUDENTS/FAMILIES

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless you have additional children attending school this year or there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time at Kurunjang Primary School, please come into the school office to collect an application form.

Please check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

SLEEP HEALTH

While we know sleep is essential for good health, research shows that many children and young people are not getting enough sleep on school nights. This can affect thinking, concentration, memory, reaction times and mood.

Research shows about 12% of primary school-aged children, a quarter of 12 to 15-year-olds and half of 16 to 17-year-olds don't get enough sleep on school nights. The recommended amount of time to sleep for primary school-aged children is 9 to 11 hours. For teenagers, it's 8 to 10 hours.

Signs that your child is not getting enough sleep can include:

- low mood and irritability during social interactions
- reluctance or arguing about getting off devices and going to bed
- falling asleep during the day
- difficulties waking up for school and sleeping in late on weekends to catch up
- changes to communicating or interacting at home.

You can help your child to improve their sleep by:

- establishing a regular sleep pattern and consistent bedtime routine
- supporting them to avoid using electronic devices such as smartphones before going to bed and in bed
- encouraging your child to exercise and spend time outside in daylight, steering clear of vigorous activity in the hour before sleep
- encouraging them to wind down and relax before going to bed

If your child is still having trouble sleeping, has persistent problems with low mood, excessive daytime sleepiness, restlessness in bed, severe snoring or wakening unrefreshed, despite getting adequate length sleep, they should see a doctor.

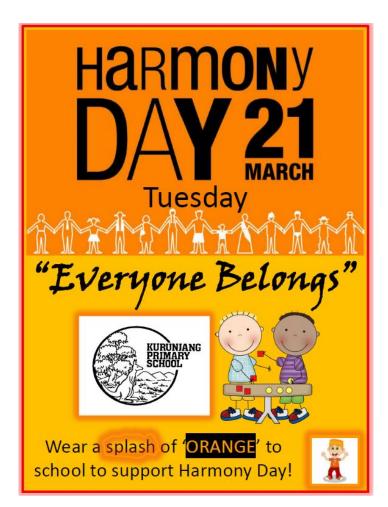

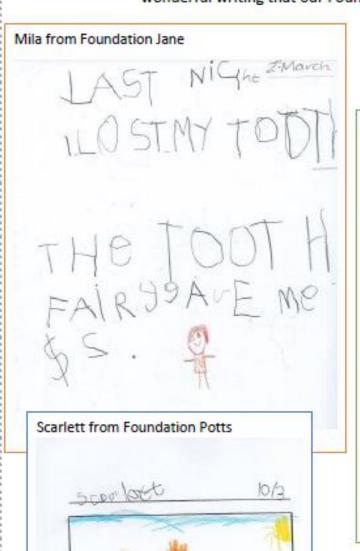

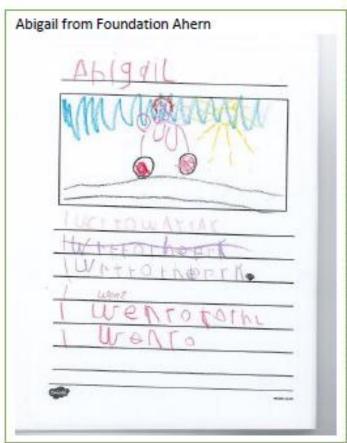

Welcome to our next 'Writing Champions' addition where we will celebrate the wonderful writing that our Foundation students are creating.





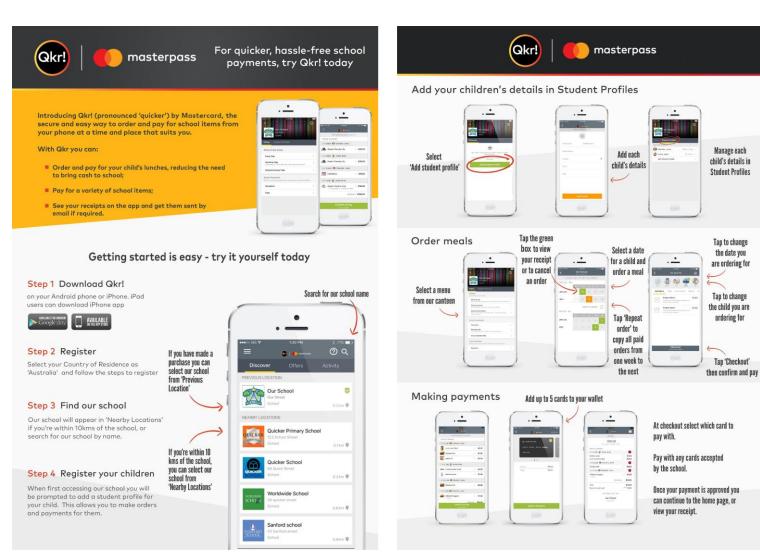
