A reminder that one of the ways we recognise and celebrate Easter at KPS is through our annual F-2 Easter Hatt Parade. TOMORROW Thursday the 6th of April, all students in F-2 will have the opportunity to participate in an Easter Hat Parade. Students have been making their Easter Hats at school during the last 2 weeks.

The Hat Parade will take place at 9.10am on the Turf Area, which is near the basketball court. In case of inclement weather, the parade will be cancelled, and students will share their hats and parade within student groupings only.

Where possible we will alert families via compass and will place a sign outside each F-2 class the morning of the proposed parade informing families of the cancelation.

Parents will not be required to help their child make a hat at home as all children will be creating a hat at school.

If you do not wish for your child to participate in the Easter Hat Parade, please let your child's teacher know as soon as possible.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, we will be sharing with you more information about our Child Safe standards in the newsletter each week. This week, we are looking at Child Safe standard 8, which is Child Safety Knowledge, Skills and Awareness.

This standard focuses on building child safety knowledge, skills and awareness in staff, volunteers and school governing authorities.

Kurunjang Primary School is committed to being a child safe organisation and embedding a child safe culture into our practices and processes to ensure all children who attend the school are safe at all times.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

To comply with this standard at Kurunjang Primary School, we:

- Provide child safety training to staff engaged in childconnected work every year. This training should include:
 - the Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy and the Child Safety Code of Conduct
 - the procedures for responding to complaints and concerns about child abuse
 - guidance on recognising indicators of child harm, including harm caused by other children and students
 - guidance on responding effectively to issues of child safety and wellbeing and supporting colleagues who disclose harm
 - guidance on how to build culturally safe environments for children and students
 - guidance on their information sharing and recordkeeping obligations
 - guidance on how to identify and mitigate child safety and wellbeing risks in the school environment without compromising a child or student's right to privacy, access to information, social connections and learning opportunities.
- Provide training and information to volunteers engaged in child-connected work that is appropriate to their role that will equip them with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children safe.
- Support staff and volunteers to implement the Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy and the Child Safety Code of Conduct where these policies apply to their role and responsibilities.
- Provide appropriate training and guidance to the members of the governing body every year. This training should include:
 - individual and collective obligations and responsibilities for implementing the Child Safe Standards and managing the risk of child abuse
 - o child safety and wellbeing risks in the school
 - the child safety policies, procedures and practices of the school.

If you require any further information about this standard or any of our other child safe standards, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Finally, as the school holidays begin, I wish each and every one of our staff, students and families a happy Easter and hope that you all have a safe, enjoyable and relaxing school holiday break.

APPLICATIONS FOR CSEF CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND FOR NEW STUDENTS/FAMILIES

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless you have additional children attending school this year or there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time at Kurunjang Primary School, please come into the school office to collect an application form.

Please check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.




