#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

With farewells in a school, they are always followed up with greeting's, I am pleased to announce that Mr Parker will be joining us at the start of term 3. Mr Parker will be teaching 3 Columbus until the end of the year.

It is that time of the year again! Cold and Flu season! Cold and Flu season is fast approaching.

Flu vaccination is recommended for everyone aged 6 months and over. Some people are more at risk of complications from the flu and are eligible for free vaccination under the National Immunisation Program including:

- anyone aged 65 years and older
- pregnant women (at any stage of pregnancy)
- all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged from 6 months and over
  - people 6 months or older with:
- heart disease
- chronic lung disease (including people with severe asthma who require frequent hospital visits)
- · chronic neurological conditions o impaired immunity
- haemoglobinopathies (blood disorders caused by genetic changes)
- · diabetes or kidney disease
- children on long-term aspirin therapy from 6 months to 10 years
- children aged from 6 months to under 5 years.

#### **ANNUAL REPORT**

Every Victorian government school is required to produce an Annual Report to their School Community by April 30 each year. Our Annual Report for 2022 will be available on our website early next week. As a school we met all quality assurance criteria required by the Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA). I encourage you to take a few minutes to look at the report.

The Department of Education conducts a thorough and independent review of each Victorian government school once every four years. This year our school is being reviewed on all of the data collected from 2019-2022, this will occur in term 4. Part of the process is to develop our new School Strategic Plan outlining goals and targets for 2024 to 2027 will be developed.

#### **EDUCATION WEEK**

Education Week is an annual celebration of education in Victoria. This year Victoria will celebrate Education Week from Sunday 14 May to Saturday 20 May. This year's theme is 'Active Learners: Move, Make, Motivate', which celebrates physical activity, hands-on learning and student voice in education.

To celebrate Education Week will be holding numerous activities for the students throughout the week. The school will have an open afternoon on Wednesday 17th May starting from 2:15pm, looking forward to seeing you joining in the classroom activities with your child/ren.

#### **CAMPS**

Expression of Interest notes for camp were sent home this week for the Year 5/6 Camp. The Year 3/4 Camp notes will go home next week.

The 3/4 camp will be at Lady Northcote (near Bacchus Marsh) from 4th to 6th of September.

The 5/6 camp will be a coastal experience at Camp Wyuna at Queenscliffe from 11th to 13th of September.

The cost of camp includes food, accommodation, hiring of camp staff to run certain activities (flying box, canoeing, raft making, archery) and transport to and from the camp.

#### **ARRIVAL TIMES**

Families, just a friendly reminder that drop off time for students each morning is from 8:40am – 9:00am. Drop off prior to 8:40am or bike riders arriving early means students are unsupervised. Staff are on active supervision from 8:40am onward each morning and the gates are open at 8:40am.

After school staff are on active supervision from 3:10pm to 3:25pm, gates are locked at 3:20pm to allow staff to return for meetings.

- Complaints, concerns and safety incidents are 10.2 analysed to identify causes and systemic failures to inform continuous improvement.
- 10.3 The organisation reports on the findings of relevant reviews to staff and volunteers, community and families, and children and young people.

## APPLICATIONS FOR CSEF CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND FOR NEW STUDENTS/FAMILIES

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless you have additional children attending school this year or there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time at Kurunjang Primary School, please come into the school office to collect an application form.

Please check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.


