PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Firstly, I hope you all had a great Mother's Day! I have spent the past few days in Canberra with family exploring the sites of our nation's capital and a quick trip to Eden to scatter a family members ashes. This leave was approved last year and

I am looking forward to returning tomorrow.

Last week I mentioned that the cold and flu season is back. We have had a few cases of COVID reported to the school. While we encourage students to stay home when unwell in order to stop the spread of germs and to aid the recovery process, we also think it is a good time to remind our students and parents that regular attendance at school is important and that a day off here and there for non-health related issues can add up and does have an impact on student learning. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day.

Attending and participating in school will help your child develop important skills and knowledge to help them learn; and also social and emotional skills such as good communication, resilience and team work. There is no safe number of days for missing school. A reminder to parents and carer's that if your child is going to be absent from school that we ask that you notify the school ASAP. If you know your child is going to be away, you can notify the office or your child's teacher in advance. The mobile phone number for attendance is no longer in use. Absences can be notified via the Compass App or by phone on 9743 0633 on the morning of the absence. We are required to follow up any unexplained absences with a phone call on the day of the absence.

e-SAFTEY

Cyberbullying of children is when someone uses online content or communication to seriously humiliate, seriously harass, seriously intimidate of seriously threaten a child or young person under the age of 18.

It can take many forms including sending abusive messages, hurtful images or videos, nasty online gossip, excluding or humiliating others, or creating fake accounts in someone's name to trick or humiliate them.

FOUNDATION ENROLMENTS 2024 ARE NOW OPEN

Parents who live within our school's designated neighbourhood area are invited to enrol their children for

Foundation 2024 at the office. To be eligible to enrol for Foundation in 2024 your child must turn 5 years of age by 30th April 2024. You must provide proof of your child's age by presenting a birth certificate. For students who were born overseas you must present their passport and visa details. Immunisation certificates are also required and may be posted to you on request by calling 1800 653 809. As the immunisation and birth certificates may take a little time to arrive, we suggest you get organised early and phone for your certificate now.

APPLICATIONS FOR CSEF CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND FOR NEW STUDENTS/FAMILIES

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless you have additional children attending school this year or there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time at Kurunjang Primary School, please come into the school office to collect an application form.

Please check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

BOOK CLUB

your child is at school, or at home, you can place your order on LOOP as normal. Online orders will close on this date for delivery at school. Please make sure all orders have the child's name, grade and correct money placed in a sealed envelope/bag.

We appreciate that families from time to time may be absent for family holidays or events. In the event that you know you will be absent please come to the office to collect a notification regarding extended absences for family holidays or events form for approval. This will enable the class and specialist teachers to be aware of the absence and for the absence to be recorded on compass.


