PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

CLASSROOM ROUTINES

Next term we will be opening the gates from 8:30am. Students will be unsupervised in the yard until 8:40am when staff start Active Supervision. A reminder that students can enter their classrooms from when the 8:50am music starts. This is the time when children come into our classrooms so they can organise the things they need for the day. To promote independence and resilience, please encourage your child to carry their own bag into the classroom and unpack it by themselves. Our learning time begins at 9:00am every day, please ensure that you have said goodbye to your child and they are in their classroom by 9:00am. Classroom teachers are available to discuss any concerns between 8:40am to 8:50am and from 3:10 to 3:20pm.

ATTENDANCE

We have focused our efforts in ensuring students are supported to be at school on time, every day, when they are healthy and well. Student attendance is critical in ensuring students feel connected to peers, teachers, and our wider school community. Additionally, consistent student attendance supports academic progress, ensuring gaps in learning do not occur following missed content in the classroom.

DO I HAVE TO GO TO SCHOOL? Yes, in Victoria everyone aged from 6 – 17 must go to school.

Missing one day a fortnight is the same as missing 4 whole weeks of school a year.




