PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Hope you have all had a great week. It is sad that I start the newsletter with a negative. A couple of staff and parents have raised concerns about some of our parents and their behaviour.

Concerns centre around parents swearing in the school yard, approaching other parents about their children, seeing an issue and deliberately not advising a member of staff, ignoring teacher instructions to leave the classroom and smoking within more than 4 metres of the school fence. Not only are parents and staff witnessing this, so are our students, and it is not appropriate!

If your child has an issue with another child, then please speak to your child's teacher, do not approach other parents.

Parents, carers, staff and students can help keep our school community safe, supportive and respectful.

Behaviours not okay in our school community are threats, harassment, violence, rudeness, discriminatory and derogatory comments, aggression, intimidation and threatening gestures.

Government schools are not public places and there is no general right for the public to enter school land at any time.

Parents and carers ordinarily have an implied licence to enter school land, but that might be temporarily withdrawn if their behaviour threatens the safety of staff or students. To protect the safety of staff or students at the school, a Principal may provide a verbal warning directing someone to leave the school or issue them with a trespass notice prohibiting them from entering the school grounds.

SCHOOL ROUTINES

There has been some confusion around the start and end of the day.

The gates will open from 8:30am.

Students will enter classrooms to start their day at 8:50am (end of music).

Classroom teachers are available to discuss any concerns between 8:40 to 8:50am and from 3:10 to 3:20pm.

School finishes at 3:10pm.

All gates will be locked at 3:25pm for staff to attend meetings.

Kurunjang Primary School is committed to being a child safe organisation and embedding a child safe culture into our practices and processes to ensure all children who attend the school are safe at all times.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

NAPLAN

NAPLAN results will be sent home with Year 3 and Year 5 students late next week. NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum. Students sat assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The questions assess content linked to the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics. Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each assessment. This scale indicates whether the student is meeting expectations for the literacy and numeracy skills needed to participate fully in that year level.

HOMEWORK

Homework has been sent home this week. Homework will be sent home fortnightly. Take home books for reading in Foundation to Year 4 should be changed daily, Years 5 and 6 at least twice a week (if reading a novel).

ARRIVING LATE / LEAVING EARLY

I would like to remind families that the procedures remain in place in relation to late arrival to school, early dismissal of students. All visitors must sign in at the office. Students arriving late must report to the office and collect a late pass. Parents collecting their children early must go to the office to sign their child/ren out.

ATTENDANCE

Did you know that:

When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much:

- They miss out on the lovely morning meet and greet that connects children to their classmates, staff and classroom environment and is an important part of children feeling that they belong
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons

 so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning
- The opportunity to prepare for the school day (including changing their Take Home book for reading that night)

Please help your child to arrive on time for and to be at school EVERY day. Please make sure that your child is only absent if they are unwell – EVERY day at school counts.

If your child has missed 5 days or less this school year. This will support your child to achieve their best at school – academically and personally.

If your child has missed more than 10 days this school year. The amount of time your child is missing will impact on their learning and their friendships.

CAUTION - If your child has missed more than 15 days this school year - your child is missing so much time from school

that it will be extremely difficult for them to keep up with their learning, their friendships and to feel connected to school.

A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence

SCHOOL UNIFORM

We have noticed an increase in students coming to school out of uniform this week, particularly students in the 3-6 area of our school. The wearing of a school uniform is compulsory at Kurunjang Primary School and as such, students are expected to be in full school uniform at all times. Can all families please make sure that students come to school dressed in uniform each day which includes school jumpers. If for some reason, there is a day or two where this cannot happen (and we do understand things will pop up on occasion) please email your child's teacher with a written note explaining why your child is out of uniform including how long your child will be out of uniform for.

REDUCING RUBBISH IN THE YARD

This term, we are going to have a focus on minimising rubbish in the school yard. We are asking for parent's support with this by trying where possible to send less rubbish to school in your child's lunchbox. This will just help us to reduce the amount of rubbish going out into the yard and into our bins and is also a great lesson for our students on looking after our environment and sustainability.




