PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The weather was definitely on our side yesterday for our Year 3 – 6 Athletics Carnival. The day was just fantastic and it was wonderful to see the great sportsmanship displayed by all our students as they cheered each other on throughout the day. It was also wonderful to see so many students and staff in their house colours on the day. All our students who competed did a fantastic job, however RED house was the overall winner on the day – congratulations to everyone in RED house on your success yesterday. Well done to Mr Andrews and Mrs Craig for organising the day.

We are almost half way through Winter and germs are certainly kicking in!

In Victoria, influenza (flu) and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) infection numbers are high among children aged 5 to 11 years, particularly in those in their first few years of school. The Victorian Department of Health expects more respiratory infections over Term 3.

Most children with flu or RSV have a mild fever, runny nose or cough. Some children, particularly babies and children with underlying medical conditions, may have more severe illness.

Keeping our school community well, parents, carers and students are encouraged to:

- wash and sanitise their hands regularly
- avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- cover their nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing
- stay at home if unwell and consult a general practitioner (GP) or NURSE-ON-CALL as needed
- stay up to date with flu and COVID-19 vaccinations.

Our school has masks for staff, students and visitors if they want to wear them.

ATTENDANCE

Since the beginning of term, we have also seen an increase in student absences too. That is to be expected at this time of year, however I do need to ask parents and carers to please either log into Compass and complete an attendance notification or contact the school via phone to notify of this absence. For each and every absence where this has not occurred, our school is required to contact parents to note down a reason for student absences. To avoid these calls, I encourage you all to complete a Compass absence notification or contact our school early on the day your child is absent. We thank you for your support with this issue.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Here are some strategies that you can implement to help us increase student attendance and reduce lateness to school:

- Ensure that your child goes to bed at a decent time on a school night - Primary aged students should be in bed asleep by 8:30pm and not be going to bed any later than 9:30pm. Ensure that you have a structured morning routine - 7am wake up, 7:15am breakfast, 7:40am get dressed, 7:50am brush teeth / brush hair / wash face, 8:00am pack lunch, 8:15am pack bag, 8:20am leave for school.
- Ensure your child only stays home if they are sick - only keep your child home when they are sick, students should not get a day off school for their birthday or to go shopping.
- Take family holidays during school holidays - if you take holidays during school days, these count towards your child's absenteeism assessment.
- If your child has separation anxiety - please notify our office so we can arrange support.
- If you have separation anxiety - you need to go to your GP to get support, as your health is sabotaging your child's future.
- If your family requires support - there are a number of support agencies that can assist families - Child First, MacKillop Family Services.

2023 NAPLAN student achievement reports will be sent home with each Year 3 and 5 student who completed NAPLAN today. These reports reflect how the students performed on the test days in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions and Mathematics. All students are to be congratulated on doing their best during the testing period which was held in March this year. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

DOGS ONSITE

Whilst Kurunjang Primary School understands that many families in our school community keep dogs as pets, to ensure that our school remains a safe and inclusive place for everyone, we have in place a number of rules that we expect all families to follow if they wish to bring their pet dog onto school grounds:

- pet dogs must be leashed at all times and in the control of a responsible adult
- pet dogs must not be tied up on school grounds or left unaccompanied
- families that bring dogs to school that exhibit signs of aggressive behaviour, bark, or jump may be asked to remove the dog from school premises.

As the Acting Principal I have the authority to prohibit certain dogs from school grounds to ensure the safety and wellbeing of staff, students and members of our school community at any time.

100 DAYS OF SCHOOL

On Friday 4th August, our Foundation students will have attended school for 100 days. At Kurunjang Primary we celebrate this important milestone by counting collections of 100 objects, having a party and dress up day. In preparation, we are asking each Foundation student to start building a collection of 100 objects that they will bring in and count on the day.

Some suggestions include: Lego bricks; hair ties; trading cards; bottle tops; stickers; straws; buttons, icy pole sticks etc. The choice is yours. Please ensure your child's collection is in a labelled container or small bag so that they can be returned safely. We will also celebrate with a party, in which we all contribute some food to share. Please note that food must be pre-packaged and store bought e.g. mini cupcakes, snack bag of chips, lolly packs, chocolates, pop-tops, juice boxes. Finally, this year we will also celebrate by dressing up as a 100-year-old person! This is not compulsory, and students are welcome to wear casual clothes on the day. Some dress up suggestions include:

- walking stick/frame
- glasses
- hair in rollers / grey hair spray
- dressing gown and slippers
- moustache / beard
- shawl, cardigan
- shirt and tie
- handbag and accessories

Additional purchases create potential allergy risks, may go against parents' wishes and leave some students feeling left out in their friendship group. All students are invited to share social eating time free to all families at Breakfast Club on Mondays and Thursday morning from 8.15am-8.40am.

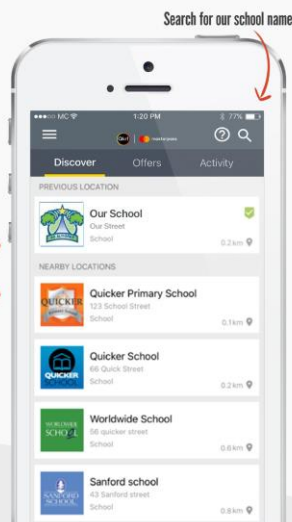

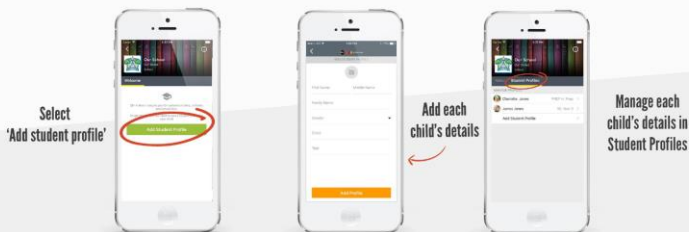
