SUBSTANTIVE PRINCIPAL POSITION

Earlier this week I met with our Senior Education Improvement Leader — Tony Simpson and he has extended the Acting Principal role at Kurunjang Primary School. This means that I will be in the role until the substantive Principal starts. Tony will be meeting with School Council on September 12th. The position will be advertised either during term 3 break or early in term 4. The substantive Principal will start at the beginning of the 2024 school year.

Toni Havers will be Acting Assistant Principal until the end of the 2023 school year.

CAMPS

With both camps fast approaching, can I please ask that if your child needs medication, if it can be dropped off to school in a zip locked bag on the following days -

Year 3/4 Lady Northcote Camp – Friday 1st September from 2:10pm – 3:30pm

Year 5/6 Camp Wyuna camp - Friday 8th September from 2:10pm-3:30pm

This allows our first aide officers time to ensure all medication has been signed in and accounted for.

If this is not possible to do so on the Friday, on the Monday of camp from 8:00am – 8:30am. Staff will meet you in the Personal Learning Studio (building near the gym).

If your child/ren are attending camp please ensure that everything has their name on it.

FATHER'S DAY STALL

We also have our Fathers' Day Stall scheduled for Thursday 31st August. We have an assortment of goodies for sale, starting at \$1 per item. This will run similarly to the Mothers' Day Stall, earlier this year.

2024 PLANNING

It is hard to believe but it is also the time of the year that we begin planning for the next year ahead! We ask that if you and your family are planning on leaving KPS at the end of 2023, please let the school office know as soon as you are in a position to do so. (This excludes Year Six students.)

Kurunjang Primary School is committed to being a child safe organisation and embedding a child safe culture into our practices and processes to ensure all children who attend the school are safe at all times.

We are now organising our staffing and grade structure for next year. We already have a high number of Foundation enrolments for next year, as well as new enrolments across the school. It is therefore VERY important that you get your enrolments forms in ASAP if you have a Foundation student starting with us next year. In addition, if you know of someone looking to transfer their children to our school in 2024, we ask that you let them know to contact us ASAP.

This is also the time for parents to place any preferences for the vear ahead. These preferences should be based on social and emotional needs only and will not be guaranteed for the year ahead

COMPASS

We would like to say a huge thankyou to the parents/carers for using the Compass app to notify the school of your child's absence. Just a few reminders when using the app:

- When you record your child's absence on Compass, please use the correct reason code for the absence. If there is no code to adequately describe the absence, please select 'Parent Choice'
- If you don't register your child as absent on Compass, you will receive a text or phone call from the school after 10am regarding your child's unexplained absence. It is a Department requirement that schools follow up on all unexplained absences daily.
- If your child is a late arrival or early departure, we do require a different process. Students must go via the office to school when arriving late for a late pass, as this ensures that they are marked correctly as class rolls are always marked first thing in the morning. For those departing school early, a parent or carer that has permission on our school records must come to or contact the office to collect your child/children.
- Please contact the office if you require any further information about absences, late arrivals or early departures.

On the topic of late arrivals, I want to remind everyone that while missing a few minutes each day may not seem like a big deal, your child may actually be missing more than you realise if he or she is continually late. Current research shows that mornings for most children are the most productive time of the day, with 10.00am the peak period for productivity.

When children arrive late and take time to settle as they inevitably do, valuable learning time is lost. If your child arrives late, they miss the important social interactions at the start of the day and the vital teacher instructional time.

It's reassuring to know that you can increase your child's chances of future success just by making sure they turn up to school on time every day. As such, please ensure your child arrives each morning by the first bell at 8.50am. They will then be able to enter their classroom and be seated ready for learning at 8.50am. If a student arrives after 9am, they will need to go via the office for a late pass.

CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

At Kurunjang Primary School, all staff are committed to creating and maintaining a child safe and child-friendly school. We work collectively to create a place where all children and young people are safe and feel safe. In a recent newsletter to families, we announced the implementation of new Child Safe Standards that took effect from July 2022 across all schools and organisations. This change has resulted in an increase in the number of standards from seven to eleven and aimed at further strengthening practices across all organisations, including schools. As part of the implementation process of these new standards, we have begun reviewing three important child safe policies, ensuring they align with these new changes. These include: 'Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy," "Responding and Reporting Obligations Policy and Procedures" and "Code of Conduct Policy." The new draft policies will be available to view

on our school website. We are committed to continuous improvement in our approach to child safety and wellbeing at our school and are seeking feedback from staff, students, families and members of our school community to ensure all key stakeholders help shape them. Please contact the school and speak to either Toni, Wendy or myself if you have any feedback or questions regarding these new policies. We thank you for your ongoing support within this very important area of school operations.




