#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **DREAM BIG**

It is extremely exciting that 6 of our Year 5/6 students will be participating in the 'Deadly Dreamin' program next month. The program is to increase opportunities for Aboriginal children and young people in Melton to connect to each other through contemporary and traditional cultural expression, to learn new skills and build cultural courage. I am looking forward to hearing from the students about the day.

#### **MELBOURNE MUSEUM**

The Year 1/2 students are getting all excited with their upcoming excursion to the Melbourne Museum. The students have been learning about "Changes Over Time". At the museum they will have the chance to see many different exhibitions including 'The Melbourne Gallery' which will give the students a chance to learn about the history of Melbourne and how it has changed over time. This will include looking at changes in the city itself as well as changes in technology and transport.

#### **SUNSMART**

We are a SunSmart school and hats must be worn outside during terms one and four. We also recommend that hats are worn outside in terms two and three but this is not compulsory. Hats need to cover children's ears and should therefore be either wide brimmed or legionnaire style. We do not provide sunscreen for the children due to possible allergies but advise parents to apply sunscreen before school. This is likely to be sufficient for the day. We are also considerate of the children's needs on hot days and monitor the outside temperature, keeping children indoors at break times if necessary. Generally, children will have a thirty minute break in the morning when it's not so hot and will stay inside at lunchtime.

#### THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA - be prepared this pollen season

Grass pollen season, which typically runs from October to December each year in Victoria, brings an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms. It also increases the risk of thunderstorm asthma. For people with asthma or hay fever, especially those who experience wheezing or coughing with their hay fever, thunderstorm asthma can be sudden, serious and even life threatening. At Kurunjang PS we implement a range of measures to keep our school community safe as the risk of thunderstorm asthma increases. We monitor the VicEmergency app to receive thunderstorm warnings, and, where appropriate, keep students indoors when weather forecasts identify greater risk. During the season, there are some things you can do to prepare and protect yourself and your family:

If your child has ever had asthma, talk to your doctor about what you can do to help protect them from the risk of thunderstorm asthma this pollen season, including updating your asthma action plan. Taking an asthma preventer properly and regularly is key to preventing asthma, including thunderstorm asthma. If your child has hay fever, see your pharmacist or doctor for a hay fever treatment plan and check if you should have an asthma reliever puffer. These are available from a pharmacy without a prescription.

If your child has hay fever and experiences wheezing and coughing, it is important to make sure they don't also have asthma. Speak to your doctor about an asthma action plan.

Where possible, avoid being outside during thunderstorms from October to December, especially during the wind gusts that come before the storm. Go inside and close your doors and windows. If you have your air conditioning on, turn it to 'recirculate'.

Protect yourself this pollen season – managing asthma and allergies matters. For more information, speak to your doctor. You can also visit the Better Health Channel website.

#### **RIDING TO SCHOOL**

Many of our students ride either bikes or scooters to school. By law anyone riding a bike or scooter must wear a helmet. It is a rule that bikes and scooters cannot be ridden on school grounds and that bikes and scooters must be walked from the school gate to and from the bike cage. Most of our primary school students do an excellent job of following this rule. Students who do not follow this rule will be followed up and a phone call will be made to the parents or carers. Please note that our bike shed is for primary school students only.

#### **CHILD SAFE**

Kurunjang PS is a Child Safe school and complies with all the requirements of the Child Safe Standards as set out in Ministerial Order 1359. As parents/carers, you play a major role in identifying and responding to child abuse within our school community. If you suspect that your child has been a victim of abuse, please contact the Victoria Police immediately. The phone number for the Melton Police Station is 9747 7999. If it is an emergency then contact 000. If you have concerns about another child's safety or wellbeing, please report this to Child Protection on 1300 664 977. All calls are completely confidential.

Kurunjang Primary School is committed to being a child safe organisation and embedding a child safe culture into our practices and processes to ensure all children who attend the school are safe at all times.

#### **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

#### **UPDATING DETAILS**

Parents and carers are reminded of the importance of ensuring the school always has the most up to date contact details. In the case of an emergency, it is imperative that we are able to get in contact with parents without delay. If your contact details have changed, please advise the office as soon as possible. Please also remember to advise the school of any Intervention Orders or Court Orders that may be in place relating to your children. A copy of the relevant orders must be provided to the school to enable us to follow the orders.

#### UNIFORM

Students need to wear full school uniform. A reminder to name all items of school uniform. Jumpers and jackets are removed during the day and can be left behind in the playground or another classroom. If they have a name on them we can return them to the child when they are found.

#### STUDENT BEHAVIOUR

Throughout this term, we are going to be continuing with our focus and spotlight on student behaviour. We have been really impressed with how our students have been responding to the increased expectations and consistency in consequences and are incredibly proud of the obvious improvements in both the yard and the classroom. Obviously, teaching the right behaviours to students, including effective conflict management strategies, is part of all children's development and growth, and we will continue to provide the support required to ensure that the positive changes we are seeing become part of our normal day to day operations. I thank each and every one of our parents and carers for your support as we really focus in on student behaviour and continue to support our students to be caring, kind, polite and considerate members of our school community.

#### **FOUNDATION ORIENTATION SESSIONS**




