### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Can you believe it is now only 6 days until the school holiday break? We really have had a great first term here at Kurunjang Primary School and are so proud of all our staff and students for the fantastic start they have made here at our school. We do have a busy final 2 weeks of term, so please make sure you keep an eye on Compass and our newsletter, so you know about all the fantastic things we have coming up at our school.

Next Thursday (28th March) is the last day for students in Term one. (Friday 29th April is Good Friday). Students will be dismissed for the holidays at 2:10 pm. We hope that you will be able to join us at 2.00pm for the final assembly. If you are unable to collect your child/ren at 2:10pm, please ensure that you make alternate arrangements for their care.

Please note that curriculum day is Monday 15th April (the day after the holidays) so the children will return to school on Tuesday 16th April.

#### **EASTER BONNET / HAT PARADE**

We will be hosting an Easter Bonnet / Fancy Hat parade on Thursday the 28th of March at 9.00am. This is an all-inclusive event, so if you do not celebrate Easter, your child will make a hat or bonnet as fancy or as crazy as they would like!! Hats and Bonnets will be made at school.

#### **HARMONY DAY**

#### **RIDE TO SCHOOL DAY**

Tomorrow, Friday 22nd March is Ride to School Day. We are encouraging all students to ride, skate, scoot or walk to school on this day. (You can also talk up "Part Way is OK" for those who must come by car – park a little further away and walk the rest of the way).

#### **CANTEEN UPDATE**

The canteen will be up and running next term. It will be open on Wednesday and Friday. All lunch orders will need to be made on the flexischools app. Over the counter sales for small items will be available during recess and lunch. More details will be posted on Compass and Facebook during the holidays.

#### **HELMETS**

There has been an increase in incidents where adults and students are not wearing helmets. We want to remind all our community members that it is a legal requirement for everyone to be wearing a helmet. If your child comes to school with a bike or scooter but no helmet, families will be asked to either collect the bike/scooter/rollerblades or drop a helmet at school.

#### **REASONABLE EXPECTATIONS**

Our staff are well aware that I expect them to be teaching during class time and not responding to parent messages. If you have an urgent message to get to your child, please call the office and they will ensure that the message is received in a timely manner. Department of Education policy states that teachers have 3 days to acknowledge a message from a parent and even longer to investigate any concerns raised. All urgent messages need to be raised with the office and at the earliest possible time someone will get back to you.

#### **ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING / SCHOOL COUNCIL**

We conducted the Annual General Meeting of the Kurunjang School Council on Tuesday night and welcomed the parents and Department of Education members for 2024.

Mrs Rachel Riordan was elected President, Mrs Bianca Bennett – Vice-President, and Mrs Deb McDonald as Treasurer.

Membership of the School Council subcommittees in Finance, Education and Policy, Buildings and Grounds, and Fundraising, were also determined.

The 2023 Annual Report was presented to School Council for their endorsement and included the summary and data for the school in the areas of school's context, achievement, engagement, wellbeing and financial position. If you were

### **NAPLAN**

I would like to congratulate our students for their efforts in Year 3 and Year 5 NAPLAN over the past two weeks. Writing was conducted last Wednesday, Reading on Thursday, and this week Language Conventions on Monday and Numeracy on Tuesday. Any students who were absent have the opportunity to sit a make-up test until tomorrow. Toni Havers has worked tirelessly to ensure that every organizational aspect and contingency was covered.

All participating students will receive their participating certificates and all should be very proud of their efforts in completing the 4 days of the online national testing program. The results of NAPLAN testing will be forwarded to schools and individuals sooner than in the past due to being online rather than hard copy.

### **ATTENDANCE**

The Department of Education is contacting me on a weekly basis to discuss and monitor students who are already at risk of chronic absenteeism. The Wellbeing Team are required to contact families and provide a report back to the Government. Student attendance is essential. If your child is on the list, please expect a call from Stacey or Danielle who are our attendance officers.

One of the goals of our Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) is to ensure that we increase student attendance and reduce student lateness. Students who are absent for 20 or more days in a year are assessed with chronic absenteeism. Research shows that there is a direct link between success later on in life and student attendance. If students are not at school, they can not be taught. If students are not being taught, then their physical and academic skills and knowledge are not being expanded. We need your support! Here are some strategies that you can implement to help us increase student attendance and reduce lateness to school:

- Ensure that your child goes to bed at a decent time on a school night - Primary aged students should be in bed asleep by 8:30pm and not be going to bed any later than 9:30pm.
- Ensure that you have a structured morning routine - 7am wake up, 7:15am breakfast, 7:40am get dressed, 7:50 brush teeth/brush hair/wash face, 8:00am pack lunch, 8:15am pack bag, 8:20am leave for school.
- Ensure your child only stays home if they are sick - only keep your child home when they are sick, students should not get a day off school for their birthday or to go shopping.
- Take family holidays during school holidays - if you take holidays during school days, these count towards your child's absenteeism assessment.
- If your child has separation anxiety - please notify our office so we can arrange support.
- If you have separation anxiety - you need to go to your GP to get support, as your health is sabotaging your child's future.
- If your family requires support - there are a number of support agencies that can assist families - Child First, MacKillop Family Services.

Thank you to all of our families that do ensure that they send their child/ren to school as often as possible and get them to school on time. We appreciate your support! If you have friends in our Kurunjang Primary community whose children have significant (4 or more days a term) absences, please remind them of the importance of school attendance.

## **APPLICATIONS FOR CSEF CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND FOR NEW STUDENTS/FAMILIES**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$150 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless you have additional children attending school this year or there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time at Kurunjang Primary School, please come into the school office to collect an application form.

Please check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

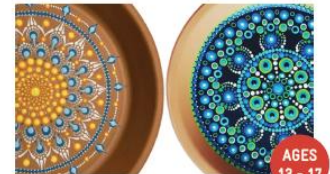
