Specialist Teachers will be available for interviews on this day. To speak to a Specialist Teacher (Visual Arts, Physical Education, Science, Performing Arts) they will be located in the Library. Bookings close at 10am on Monday 12th August.

If you are having any issues with booking on Compass or have any questions, please call our Office on (03) 9743 0633 or visit our office in person for our Office Staff to assist you. Please note that there is no school for students on this day, however students are required to be present at their Parent Teacher Interview booking with their parent/guardian.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

With Winter now well and truly setting in, I would like to remind all families to please ensure that jumpers and jackets worn to school are expected to be in line with our uniform policy and be in our school colours. I would also like to remind everyone to please make sure you clearly label your child's jumpers and jackets as these are often removed throughout the day and are therefore easily lost or misplaced. Having these items clearly labelled makes it easier to return them to the correct owner.

EXPECTATIONS OF BEHAVIOUR IN THE SCHOOL

The Department of Education describes the positive behaviour expected from parents, carers, and other adults in Victorian school communities. The policy sets clear standards of behaviour to create a safe, respectful, and inclusive learning environment for students, staff and adults. There are also other resources to support safe and respectful relationships in our school community, including information about getting involved in the school, advice on how to raise a concern or complaint, and parenting support resources for more information please refer to our school website.

ARRIVING LATE / LEAVING EARLY

I would like to remind families that the procedures remain in place in relation to late arrival to school, early dismissal of students. All visitors must sign in at the office. Students arriving late must report to the office and collect a late pass. Parents collecting their children early must go to the office to sign their child/ren out.

SCHOOL ROUTINES

Just a reminder that the gates will open from 8:30am.

Students will enter classrooms to start their day at 8:50am (end of music).

Classroom teachers are available to discuss any concerns between 8:40 to 8:50am and from 3:10 to 3:20pm.

School finishes at 3:10pm.

All gates will be locked at 3:25pm for all staff to attend meetings. The office will be closed from 3:45pm.

Breakfast Club is Monday, Tuesday and Thursday mornings in the PLS (near canteen) from 8:15am to 8:40am.

NAPI AN

NAPLAN results will be sent home with Year 3 and Year 5 students tomorrow. NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum. Students sat assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The questions assess content linked to the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics. Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each assessment. This scale indicates whether the student is meeting expectations for the literacy and numeracy skills needed to participate fully in that year level.

REDUCING RUBBISH IN THE YARD

This term, we are going to have a focus on minimising rubbish in the school yard. We are asking for parent's support with this by trying where possible to send less rubbish to school in your child's lunchbox. This will just help us to reduce the amount of rubbish going out into the yard and into our bins and is also a great lesson for our students on looking after our environment and sustainability.




LATE ARRIVALS:
