#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents and Carers,

#### **MATHEMATICS GAMES DAY**

Yesterday, Toni, Mr Gatt and 12 students (Winter, Tatum, Fiona, Nikola, Grace, Zainab, Zoey, Nouraiz, Vishav, and Tate) represented Kurunjang Primary School at the Melton Mathematics Games Day. The Games Day was intellectually challenging, competitive and fun. #### FOUNDATION ENROLMENTS FOR 2026 ARE NOW OPEN

Parents who live within our school's designated neighbourhood area are invited to enrol their children for Foundation 2026 at the office. To be eligible to enrol for

Foundation in 2026 your child must turn 5 years of age by 30<sup>th</sup> April 2026. You must provide proof of your child's age by presenting a birth certificate. For students who were born overseas you must present their passport and visa details. Immunisation certificates are also required and may be posted to you on request by calling 1800 653 809. As the immunisation and birth certificates may take a little time to arrive, we suggest you get organised early and phone for your certificate now.



## MODIFIED OR PETROL POWERED BICYCLES

Illegal.




#### MOTORBIKES

- To ride on or off-road it must be registered with a full or recreation registration
- Helmet must be worn at all times.



#### **E-BIKES**

- 25 km/h MAX speed
- Motor cannot provide power at speeds higher than 25km/h
- Helmet must be worn at all times
- No passengers
- Cannot be ridden on footpaths.



#### **E-SCOOTER**

- Be aged 16 yrs or over
- Max speed 20 kmph
- · Helmet must be worn at all times
- No passengers
- Cannot be ridden on footpaths.
